Toshima Church was established in 1948 by the missionary of the St. Columban Ireland Association, and in June 1956 the present church was consecrated. "St. Patrick" on stained glass window is set in front of the church as the Patron Saint of Toshima church. Since April 2003, the in-charge priest moved from the missionary of the St. Columban Association and the church became a Parish of Archdiocese of Tokyo.

Saint Patrick is the Apostle and patron saint of Ireland. Born in Scotland in 389 and died in about 461 years. He was a Christian missionary given credited with converting Ireland to Christianity. The holiday is March 17th, celebrated internationally, and we celebrate St. Patrick, a patron saint in our church. The small three-leaf Shamrock was the tool reputedly used by Saint Patrick to illustrate the Holy Trinity. This statue was donated by the Ambassador of Ireland.

Mass Schedules

The Mass is the central liturgical service of the Eucharist in the Catholic Church. Everyone is welcome in the church regardless of faith or denomination. It takes about 1 hour on Sundays and about 30 minutes on weekdays.

Sunday 9:30 AM (Japanese 12:00 Noon (English)

Weekdays 7:30 AM (Tue, Wed, Fri, Sat.)

The English Mass started in January 1989 in Toshima church. It is offered every Sunday with cooperating priest, Father John Joseph Puthenkalam, a Jesuit priest. Foreigners from 10 countries are coming to join the mass.

The Church

Toshima church was constructed and designed by the Architect Antonin Raymond. He was born in Czech Republic. He came to Japan in 1919 and employed with Frank Lloyd Wright, and worked together on the Imperial Hotel. He spent a long time in Japan, where he achieved many of his works. The art and architecture of Toshima church are the concrete walled structure in a folded plate configuration, set of stained glass windows lining the walls, bringing light, color and beauty. The bench, equipment fittings, door knobs of the church etc are designed by Noemi.

Statue of the Virgin Mary



Sculptured by Yasutake Funakoshi (1912-2002)

Yasutake Funakoshi was born in Iwate Prefecture in 1912 and aspired to Rodin to be a sculptor. The statue is made out of a mixture of marble and sandstone, but since 1950, a unique style has been established for works of religious themes supported by Catholic faith. One of the works representing Japanese sculptures after the war is the 26 martyr monument built in Nagasaki City. The statue of Mary was erected in Toshima church in 1959.
